Why Does Our Group Need An InterGroup Representative?

Worcester Regional Area Intergroup steering committee is set up to help handle the administrative activities of the intergroup office. The WAI Steering Committee holds regularly scheduled meetings and deals with policy and plans. Periodically, the steering committee reports to group representatives any Intergroup problems and accomplishments. It is extremely important to keep a two way flow of information going between the intergroup and groups. As an Intergroup Representative we are able to hear the group's conscience on issues concerning Worcester Area Intergroup. The rep is a trusted servant and at times is asked to vote in the best interest of his/her group. The rep also carries the AA message back to the group and keeps its members informed on the AA information given from the service committee present at the meeting.

Traditions Checklist

These questions were originally published in the AA Grapevine in conjunction with a series on the Twelve Traditions that began in November 1969 and ran through October 1971. While they were originally intended primarily for individual use, many AA groups have since used them as a basis for wider discussion.

STEP 8: Made a list of all persons we had harmed and became willing to make amends to them all.

TRADITION 8: Alcoholics Anonymous should remain forever nonprofessional, but our service centers may employ special workers.

TRADITIONS CHECK LIST :

- 1. Is my own behavior accurately described by the Traditions? If not, what needs changing?
- 2. When I chafe about any particular Tradition, do I realize how it affects others?
- 3. Do I sometimes try to get some reward-even if not moneyfor my personal AA efforts?
- 4. Do I try to sound in AA like an expert on alcoholism? On recovery? On medicine? On sociology? On AA itself? On psychology? On spiritual matters? Or, heaven help me, even on humility?
- 5. Do I make an effort to understand what AA employees do? What workers in other alcoholism agencies do? Can I distinguish clearly among them?
- 6. In my own AA life, have I any experiences which illustrate the wisdom of this Tradition?
- 7. Have I paid enough attention to the book Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions? To the pamphlet AA Tradition-How It Developed?
