The following is an excerpt from the Self Support pamphlet with recommendations for distributing funds. This is only suggested and each group has the right to it's own group conscience for distribution.





What is Bridging the Gap?

Simply put, a temporary contact is an A.A. member or group who works closely with clients who are being released from a treatment facility and helps then to **bridge the gap** to Alcoholics Anonymous in the local Community.

Here are some available A.A. pamphlets that are helpful:

My experience has been that it is an honor and privilege to receive a call on the 800 # from someone being discharged from a treatment facility looking for that first contact with the outside. There is a guideline that this is basic 12th step work. Always use two people when making contact with our newcomer, at least one should have a year of sobriety. Guys with guys, gals with gals.

The Treatment Facilities Committee is trying very hard to update our Temporary Contact Program sign up list. This list is a Confidential A. A. document used only for and by the Bridging the Gap Temporary Contact Program.
